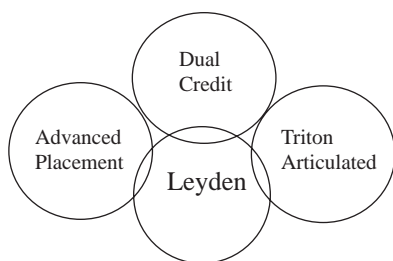

Leyden High Schools have formed a partnership with Triton Community College to provide college credit for qualified students who successfully complete specified Advanced Placement (AP) and articulated courses. Dual Credit courses are offered at Triton College, Walgreens, and Ms. Roberts Academy. Students need to review course offerings in the Course Planning Handbook and ask counselors about details to meet the expectations.

To be eligible for AP credit, students must qualify for college admission. Entrance standards for specific AP courses are available from your counselor. Students who qualify for admission and are enrolled in a specified AP course must earn a “C” or better to receive AP credit. College transcripts will be generated by Triton College for all who enroll and successfully complete the AP program. Students who earn less than a “C” will be withdrawn from the course with a “W.” Students planning to enroll in dual-credit courses must meet prerequisites, pass a college placement exam, and enroll in the Cooperative Work Program.

Articulated courses are included in Career Pathways—sequenced course offerings for students preparing for postsecondary training in a particular skill area. Programs may include career certification, 2-year degrees, or 4-year degrees.
