REGISTRATION

Incoming Freshmen (Class of 2015): February 14-February 18

Upperclass (Class of 2014 and Beyond): April 4-June 7

It is important for students to enroll early. Courses will be closed when registrations have reached maximum size or canceled if there is insufficient paid registration by Tuesday, June 7. Seats will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis and enrollments past the listed deadline will be considered based on space availability. Students should see their counselor to obtain a course recommendation then complete the registration process through one of the options listed below.

Option #1: Leyden Web Site Enrollment. Registration can be completed online at www.leyden212.org. You will need the student's school ID number and payment can be made with a credit/debit card (Visa/MasterCard).

Option #2: On-site enrollment at each campus. Cashiers at each campus will enroll students and accept payment. Cashiers can accept checks, cash, or credit/debit cards (Visa/MasterCard).

Full payment will be due at the time of registration, and refunds will only be issued if a course is canceled due to insufficient enrollment. Checks should be made payable to: Leyden High Schools. Fees also apply to courses to be audited without credit.

Enrollment is limited to students residing within District 212 boundaries. All non-Leyden students must enroll in Mr. Storaasli's office at the East campus and proof of residency is required. For information, please call Diane Klinger at 847-451-3095.

GENERAL INFORMATION

DATES/HOURS

Classes begin on Monday, June 13, and conclude on Thursday, July 21. Dates of attendance: (June 13, 14, 15, 16, 20, 21, 22, 23, 27, 28, 29, 30, and July 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 13, 14, 18, 19, 20, 21). Most classes run in two time slots:

Time Slot 1: 7:30 a.m. - 10:00 a.m.

Time Slot 2: 10:10 a.m. - 12:40 p.m.

Classes running on a different schedule indicate this in the course description. Students may take two classes (one class per time slot, one-half unit of credit per class) to earn a maximum of one unit of credit. Classes running on a different schedule indicate dates/times in the course description.

ATTENDANCE

Because of the short duration of summer school, being present and on time every day is very important. There are no excused absences. ANY COMBINATION OF ABSENCES AND TARDIES BEYOND FOUR DAYS WILL BE SUFFICIENT FOR DROPPING A STUDENT FROM CLASS WITH A "TF" GRADE. Four tardies to class count as one absence. The student's parent or guardian is expected to telephone the summer school office each day the student is absent. There will be no refund of tuition when a student is dropped because of poor attendance, tardies, or for disciplinary reasons.

Don't be absent or tardy—

Remember, four tardies equal one absence. A 'tardy' is late arrival within the first ten minutes of class. Students arriving later than ten minutes to class will be marked absent for a full day.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE

All school rules and regulations apply during summer school. Students committing minor offenses (Level I or II as defined by the Code of Conduct) will be warned once. Students will be removed from the program with no refund for any further violation and receive a withdrawal failure (WF). This is equivalent to a failing grade counted toward a student's GPA. There are no detentions, BICs, or suspensions during summer school.

Students who commit any serious offenses (Level III or IV as defined by the Code of Conduct) will be removed from summer school on the first offense and will receive a WF grade and no refund will be issued.

FRESHMAN COURSE OFFERINGS

ENRICHMENT COURSE OFFERINGS

Computer Literacy

BUS170

.5 credit

Computer Literacy teaches the fundamentals to use a computer for personal and academic needs. Topics in the touch typing method and applications using Internet and Web 2.0 resources, Word and PowerPoint to format documents and presentations. Students are introduced to the Leyden network, computer ethics, and file management. Students also establish accounts for career and college exploration. This course is taught using the Blackboard learning management system. Students have two enrollment options:

- 1.) Enroll in a traditional course that meets on campus for 2.5 hours over 24 days. *Daily attendance required.*
- 2.) Enroll in an online course. Online students will be required to meet on campus for 2 days June 13 and 14. The remainder of the course will be delivered online. Students who enroll in the online option must have a computer with access to the Internet. A business teacher will be on campus daily during regular summer school hours to assist online students. *Daily attendance not required.*

Global Studies I: College Prep

SOC130

.5 credit

Global Studies I (College Prep) is a course that introduces students to the world in which they live through the investigation of various topics: geography, religion, global conflict, and genocide. Throughout the summer, students will be expected to analyze five themes of geography through readings and class discussions. The five major regions of the world are explored through primary source material and class analysis. Both units culminate with a classroom test and an independent student essay. College Prep Students should expect at least 1 hour of homework each night in preparation for full participation of the class discussions and analysis. *Daily attendance required.*

Global Studies I: Honors

SOC161

.5 credit

Global Studies I Honors students investigate the same topics as Global Studies College Prep students, but should expect a deeper level of rigor. Additional emphases for this course include developing literacy skills, writing proficiencies, and critical thinking strategies. For example, Honors students will read two novels as a part of this course, and should expect 1-2 hours of homework each night. *Daily attendance required.*

ENRICHMENT COURSE OFFERINGS

Summer Marching Band

MUS151

.5 credit

The Leyden Marching Band experience is open to ALL students, regardless of prior experience. Students receive academic credit for successful completion of required class hours and marching band performance activities. Class meets at the West campus on select summer evenings so that students may also enroll in regular daytime summer courses. Students who earn an "A" in Marching Band and have a weighted GPA greater than 4.0 in the first semester will have the option to audit this course.

Algebra II Summer Transition (*Enrichment Curriculum*)

MAT244 MAT245

non-credit

This course is designed to supplement 8th grade Algebra curriculum so that students are fully prepared to start Freshman Algebra II Honors. Prerequisite: 17 or higher on the Explore Placement exam and placement based on departmental honors placement exam in May. **All incoming freshmen are required to have a TI-Nspire calculator.** Information regarding the purchase of this calculator will be provided on the first day of class. Tuition for this course is \$100. This course will run from 6/13 through 6/30 in two time slots.

LEYDEN FRESHMAN ACADEMY

Leyden District 212 Board of Education has established a mandatory academy experience for incoming freshmen who demonstrate serious gaps in reading and/or math skills. There is no cost to students for this program. ***Students who do not attend will be placed in a required study session from 3:00-3:25 each day during their first year of high school.*** Students will be assigned to one or two of the following time slots based on their need in math, reading, or both.

1st Period (7:30-8:50) 2nd Period (9:00-10:20) 3rd Period (10:30-11:50)

Days of Attendance: Same as summer school. (See page 3.)

UPPERCLASS COURSE OFFERINGS

TRADITIONAL CREDIT RECOVERY OFFERINGS

These courses will run in 2 time slots for six weeks. Daily attendance is mandatory.

Reading

ENG191 ENG 192 .5 credit
Recommended for current Leyden students who have failed Reading I or Reading II. Development of reading comprehension and vocabulary skills are emphasized. Study skills also are an important topic. The EXPLORE test is administered at the end of the course, giving students a chance to fulfill Leyden's reading graduation requirement.

Consumer Education

BUS250 .5 credit
Consumer Education helps students understand the world of business and how it affects them on a daily basis. Primary goals are to develop characteristics, habits, practices, and skills that help students be better citizens and consumers. Units include banking, the American economic system, comparison shopping, advertising, budgeting, credit and installment purchasing, consumer rights and responsibilities, types of insurance and consumer protection agencies. This course meets the consumer education requirement for graduation.

ESL courses run from 7:30 a.m.-12:40 p.m. for 3 weeks. Daily attendance is mandatory.

Beginning/Intermediate ESL

ESL111 ESL112 .5 credit
Students will focus on building vocabulary and communicative competence. A video series is utilized to further vocabulary acquisition as well as to incorporate reading, writing, and listening into the program. Students read short stories and participate in discussions. Students who successfully complete this course receive elective credit towards graduation. The course is offered to students at no tuition cost; however, they must pay a \$5 registration fee.

ESL 3

ESL301 ESL302 .5 credit
This course is intended for students who must repeat ESL 3 due to failure, as well as students who want to move from ESL 2 to English I during the school year, and students looking for enrichment or graduation credits. This course correlates directly with the regular ESL 3 course. Students read two novels, complete a research paper, give informative speeches, and fulfill an independent reading requirement. In order to receive ESL 3 credit and advance to English I, students must receive an A in both sessions of summer school. Students repeating the class due to failure must achieve a passing grade in order to receive credit. Students taking the class for enrichment purposes receive elective credit upon successful completion of the course. The course is offered to students at no tuition cost; however, they must pay a \$5 registration fee.

UPPERCLASS COURSE OFFERINGS

ONLINE CREDIT RECOVERY OFFERINGS

(Attendance is mandatory until all course work is completed.)

Most credit recovery courses will be delivered using the Apex online curriculum. An adult facilitator will be present in class at all times to answer student questions and proctor assessments. Students may work outside of class to complete course work and need not attend class once the course is complete. All course work must be completed by Thursday, July 21.

Driver Education

Classroom and behind-the-wheel instruction will be offered if enrollment is sufficient. Classes will meet from 7:30 a.m. - 10:00 a.m. at the West Campus on the following days: June 13-17, 20-24, 27 & 28. Students must reside within the Leyden district and pay a \$5 registration fee for classroom and \$150 for behind-the-wheel (paid in class). Behind-the-wheel instruction begins on Wednesday, June 1. Consumer Education -- Online

BUS310 .5 credit
The curriculum is offered in conjunction with the Illinois Virtual School and meets the required curriculum as outlined in the School Code. Students must be self-directed and will complete most course requirements on their own. Students must attend an orientation meeting on Tuesday, June 14 from 1 to 2 p.m. at West Leyden in Room 161. The course officially begins on June 15 and must be completed by Thursday, July 21. Tuition is \$225.
