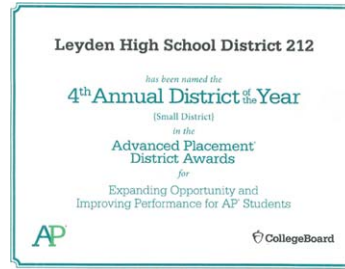

COMMUNITY

Leyden High School District 212 is a comprehensive high school district located in Chicago's near west suburbs. Students live in Northlake, Franklin Park, Schiller Park, River Grove, Rosemont, and unincorporated areas of Melrose Park.

ACCREDITATION

Leyden is fully accredited by AdvancED and the Illinois State Board of Education.

FACULTY

There are 293 licensed teachers of which 80.4% have a master's degree or higher. There are 16 full-time counselors, six social workers, two full-time speech pathologists, and two health care aides.

SCHEDULE

Leyden uses a schedule that allows students to take seven courses per semester.

ATHLETICS

Leyden students have the opportunity to participate in 23 interscholastic sports, 11 sports for young women and 12 for young men. Participation is offered on several levels, including Varsity, Jr. Varsity, Sophomore, and Freshmen. There is also a full intramural program for those choosing a less challenging involvement. Outstanding facilities include swimming pools, fitness centers, and a climbing wall.

- Physical Education — 4 credits
- Science — 2 credits
- Social Studies — 2 credits*

*For the Class of 2020 and beyond, students will be required to earn 2.5 credits of social studies which must include .5 credit in civics. The successful completion of civics will satisfy the Constitution requirement.

**Health may be taken in lieu of physical education.

GRADE WEIGHTING
